1. Write Now!

Have your students write for each of the Weekly Writing Corner topics below to find the Kid Scoop page that goes with each writing prompt. Or call the paper and see if they would print some of your student writing over the summer. That would get families watching the newspaper.

2. Let your parents in on the fun!
